

Church Services:

Drive-in services will continue to be held each Sunday at 8:30 A.M., 9:30 A.M., and 10:30 A.M. With covid spreading faster than ever and hospitals filling up, our Covid Safety Committee recommended we keep indoor activities closed through February. Council voted unanimously to approve the continued closure of indoor services and activities through February. One of our worship pastors, Bennie Florendo, recently died from covid. His wife Christine is also one of our pastors, our Conference Secretary and a medical doctor. Please pray for comfort for her and the family.

Devotional by Pastor Dennis:

Recently, I lost my cell phone. It is interesting how consuming a lost valuable can become. Perhaps you have lost a wallet or pocketbook, important phone number, car or house keys? Your mind begins to rehearse every place where you may have left it. You begin praying for God's help. You carefully search each place you had been and when you don't find it you feel a growing disappointment, anxiety and fear. You enlist others to help with the search. Julia and I searched the house, the Jeep and the alley, no cell phone. I felt my self fearing an important missed call, like from one of the funeral homes. Thursday evening I had Ad Council meeting and during my devotional I shared about my lost cell phone and the need for greater self-discipline to insure it stays in my possession. After the meeting several members called my number but no ring from my cell phone. Luke 15 is the "Lost and Found" chapter of the Bible. Three things are lost and then found: a sheep, a coin and a son. In each case, Jesus says, "there is rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who turns to God and is found." The climax of the chapter is the return of the prodigal son to his father. Jesus says, "The young man came to his senses and determined in his heart to return to his father. While the young man was a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him." This is a beautiful picture of our heavenly father waiting for those who are lost (perhaps yourself) to return. There is no condemnation but only compassion so don't hesitate to return to the Good Shepherd. Friday morning, Julia and I came to the church to continue our search for the lost cell phone. Julia even searched the garbage bags in the dumpster. Still no cell phone. Then I thought of an address I needed so I went to my office pulled my church directory off my desk and from underneath out popped my cell phone. I began rejoicing and praising the Lord for my cell phone now found. I ran to the dumpster to tell Julia the search was over. She too rejoiced! We who are found are to rejoice when others are found in Christ. This is not always the case as with the elder brother who begrudged the celebration party the father hosted for the returned prodigal son. Christians may feel, "I have been serving the Lord for years and no one is throwing a party for me." But Jesus concludes with these words of warning, "My Son or Daughter, you are always with me, and everything I have is yours. But we had to celebrate and be glad, because this brother of yours was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!"

The Lord's Supper:
