A few helpful hints for solving:

One-letter words will be I or a (or possibly O).

The pattern "abca" is frequently the word "that".

A common three-letter word is likely to be the.

A frequent two-letter combination that occurs at both beginning and end of words might be "th".

Count the letters. The most frequently-occurring letter in English is e followed by t, a, o, n, i, s, r, and h.

Apostrophes can occur before s, t, d, or ll. If before t, the previous letter is n.

Each word/syllable must contain a vowel (a, e, i, o, u, or y).

Capitalized words may be names or terms for deity.

Common first letters are: t, a, o, s, h, i, w, c, and b.

Common last letters are: e, s, t, d, n, r, and y.

Common two-letter words are of, to, in, is, it, as, he, be, by, on, or, at, my, an, so, and if.

If you get stuck, guess a letter. You can easily undo it if it doesn't lead anywhere.
